[2] La series fue vire por Dan Signer, guionista y coproducer ejecutivo de esta y creador de las series de Disney XD. La primera serie fue estrenada durante la presentación de Lemonade Mouth. Tiene lugar en San Francisco y cuenta como protagonista de China Anne McClain como China Parks, uno estudiante de intermediae in a talent program for your local high school called Advanced natural talents (or ANT). In Latin America was pre-released Sunday, August 21, 2011, after the premiere of Phineas and Ferb. By its second dimension and its official premiere was Friday, September 16, 2011, and Spain was officially released on November 11, 2011 by the Disney Channel and ended on May 21, 2014. On November 30, 2011, A.N.T. However, he appears in a single episode as a special guest. [7] On December 26, 2013, McClain announced via Twitter that the third season would be the last in the series. [8] Synopsis A.N.T. Farm revolves around China Parks (China Anne McClain), an 11-year-old musical marvel that has just become the new ANT (Natural Skills and Talents) in the A.N.T. program at Webster San Francisco High School in California. On her first day, she meets Olive Doyle (Sierra McCormick), a girl who has an eidetic memory, and Fletcher Quimby (Jake Short), an artistic genius who falls deeply in love with her when they meet, who soon become her best friends in high school. You will continue to go on several adventures, using your talents for your benefit. The most popular school, Lexi Reed (Stefanie Scott), continues to intimidate China, thinking of it as a competition. Lexi's best friend Paisley (Alle DeBerry) and Fletcher's friend Angus (Aedin Mincks) have a recurring role in the series. Season 3 takes place at a boarding school called Z-tech, instead of Webster High School. The school is run by a large technology company, Z Tech, owned by Zoltan Grundy (Dominic Burgess). The series ended with Fletcher (Jake Short) winning an art scholarship in New York City and moved there with her 30-year-old grandmother. The Disney Channel development production announced on November 11, 2010 that they had the green light for the production of the show, which began in early 2011 [9] The show was awarded for the first time when Dan Signer, creator of the series, saw in China Anne McClain. The Girl was so confident, she can make a joke, she can sing , she can play the instruments just like China was some kind of prodigy child [...] And then I realized: Why not build an exhibition around a child prodigy? Someone who has all this natural talent and ability, but is still affected when sent to a high school at the age of 11, said Dan Signer an interview. [10] On November 19, 2011, the series was renewed for the second season, filming will begin in early December. [11] The actress was taken after an audition in which she talked continuously about tigers. Dan Signer said: "She was talking about tigers all the time, and I thought, 'That's what Olive would sound like' because Olive talks fast, she's smart and her talent is memory. [10] Jake Short was the last of the three main characters to be cast. Caroline Sunshine was originally cast as Lexi and Stefanie Scott as Tinka Hesseheffer in Shake It Up!, but Dan Signer decided that Sunshine would be better than Tinka and Scott as Lexi, so the two changed roles. In addition to the Chinese songs Anne McClain and cast members Stefanie Scott and Carlton Jeffrey, it contains two songs from China and her sisters, such as 'The McClain Sisters, which led to her debut album on Hollywood Records in 2012. [12] Two singles were released from this soundtrack. The first to be published was Dynamic. The second that will be the Call of All Monsters. The song was the first single to reach number one, reaching number 86 in the United States and number 2 in two other countries. The third single released was Unstoppable. Release Ratings The show's preview gained 4.4 million viewers on its opening night, ranked 1st among the TV series broadcast on a total day among teens and teens 9-14 (441,000/1.8 ratings) and was also the number 1 TV series among the Telecast 6-11 children (544,000/2.2 ratings). [13] Its premiere came at the end of The Suite Life on Deck series, amassing 4.6 million euros. [13] The episode of The PHANTom Locker is currently the most-watched episode of the series, marking 4.6 million viewers. [11] He did better than the premiere by joining Wizards of Waverly Place, which has 4 million viewers. [11] The New York Experiences episode is currently the show's least watched episode, with just 1.9 million viewers, which is also the end of the third and final season. [1] 2002: In Venezuela, President Hugo Chavez re-evaluates power after being deposed by a coup two days earlier. 2003: At the London Marathon, British runner Paula Radcliffe sets a new world record in the themeny marathon's athletic specialty after scheduling a two-hour, 15-minute, 25-second sign. 2009: Published in the first page of the home site created by Andrew Hussie. 2010: A 7.1 magnitude earthquake in western Chinaese Qinghai on the Richter scale causes at least 300 deaths. 2012: In Mexico two simos shake a large part of the country, the first was 5.4 degrees on the Richter scale at 5:10 local time. The second was 5.3 degrees Richter at 8:06. 2014: Nicaragua has a low-intensity earthquake, which experts say trigger the 1972 earthquake failure.
